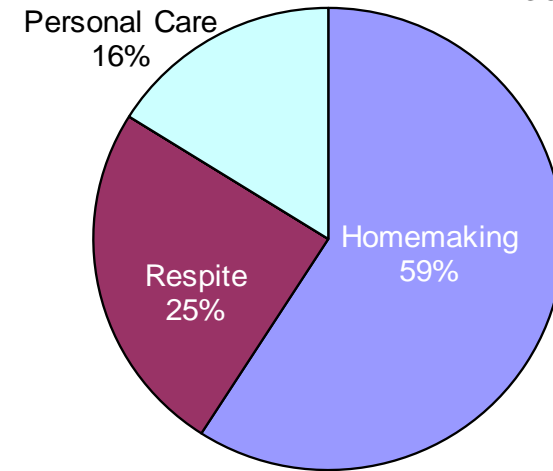

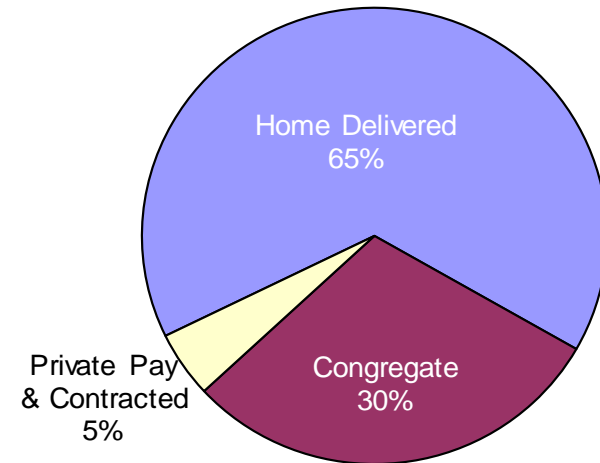

Senior Center Activities

- 57 activities offered & attended by 914 unduplicated people.
- Average monthly attendance = 992
- Average daily visitors = 71
- Most popular = Concerts with 222
- Most popular weekly activity was Bingo with 81 participants.

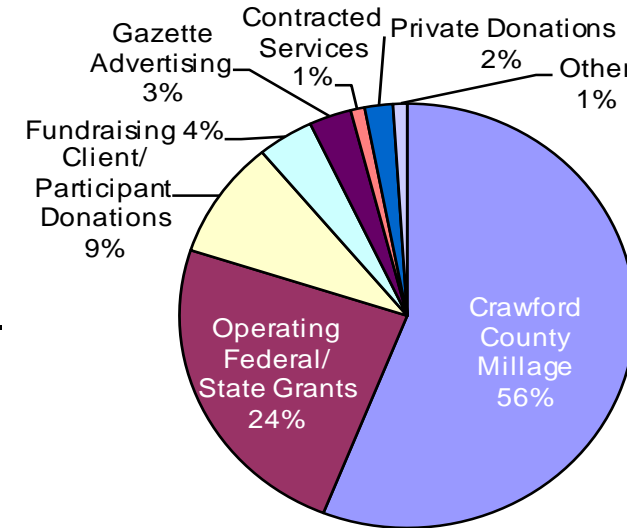
Commission on Aging Programs

- 578 boxes of Food Commodities were delivered to 51 people.
- 253 hours were spent counseling 201 seniors with their Medicaid and Medicare benefits.
- 215 seniors received "Senior Project Fresh" farm market coupons.
- 66 loans of medical equipment made.
- 126 people received assistance thru our Advocacy services.
- 93 Medical Transports were provided to 34 individuals.

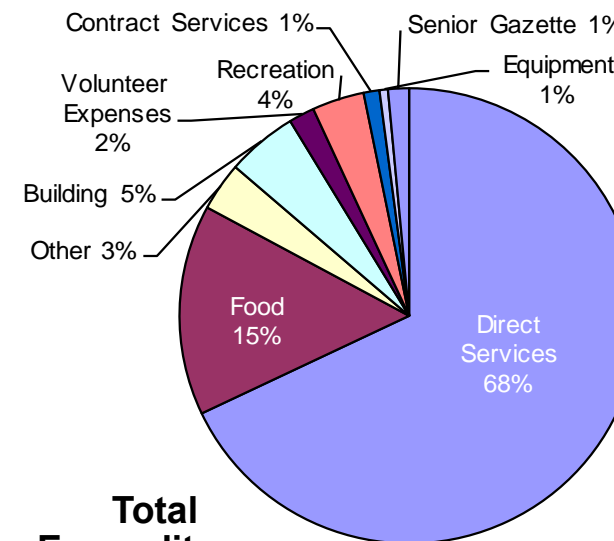
Thank You Volunteers!!
